Commitment to and experience in citizen science

I am a member of Citizen Science Australia. I have participated in citizen science activities, such as wildlife tracking. I am also interested in the scope of citizen science to assist in dispute resolution research, including indigenous and other approaches to conflict and its management. I am a rural resident and think there is enormous scope for citizen science to contribute to research in most (if not all) fields, and I think it is a valuable tool for building public trust in science through active participation in scientific research. I recently completed my PhD thesis in which I recommended the use of citizen science approaches for further research in the field of dispute resolution and law.

During the past ten years, I have been a Board member/Director of several NFP organisations and have been instrumental in helping them develop a more active and inclusive base. I have also been responsible for managing key project budgets (including of a national conference). In one of those organisations, I oversaw the review of its governance and structures to safeguard its future. None of the Directorships was a remunerated position. Being a member of the ASCA Management Committee would be a particularly exciting role with scope for overseeing the Association's continued development of innovative approaches to science research.

Stakeholder Engagement Ability to work and communicate with multiple and diverse stakeholders to achieve positive outcomes, including government (local, state and federal), scientific community, community groups, educators and the private sector

I have a strong reputation for communicating with and actively engaging diverse stakeholders specifically for achieving positive outcomes. I have taken a leading role in engaging government, scientists, community groups and diverse population groups in specific activities. For example, I am currently overseeing the planning for a national conference whose focus will be on Indigenous approaches to conflict and its management. This continues to require close engagement with a range of Indigenous groups within Australia, in particular around Central Australia. Of some concern is devising methods of presenting the conference using only an online format.
