Presented annually by the Australian Museum, the Eureka Prizes are Australia's most comprehensive national science awards, rewarding excellence in the fields of research & innovation, leadership, science engagement and school science.

For the second year there will be a citizen science specific prize. The Eureka Prize for **Innovation in Citizen Science** is awarded to an individual or team for demonstrated excellence in citizen science practice, through an innovative research and community engagement project. \$10,000 is up for grabs thanks to the Department of Industry, Innovation and ScienceInspiring Australia!
