Sunny has worked on a range of research, conservation and environmental education projects. Most recently a PhD looking at the impacts of large-scale oil palm development on Native Customary Rights landowners in Sarawak, Malaysia. She undertook this research after seeing first-hand the environmental and social impacts of large-scale agricultural development in Borneo since 1999.

Previous projects there include a Research Masters in Ecology on hybrid gibbon vocalisations in the upper Barito Ulu catchment, and she also managed the Gunung Palung Orangutan Project in West Kalimantan.

Back in Brisbane, she has long-term experience teaching about ecology, the environment and communities, particularly in Southeast Queensland. She is also passionate about environmental education and science communication.
