Dear,



I've been in the chair's role for about six months now and there has never been a dull moment. I've learnt a lot about citizen science and how important it is to society, let alone science. I'm meeting and working with some wonderful people and enjoying the support and understanding of the ASCA management team and past leaders.

I'm loving the diversity that is citizen science. It is a broad and flexible concept that can be adapted to different disciplines and situations, and it can make a difference on many levels. For example, in the space of one week in May, I was lucky enough to participate in three separate conferences focused on quite different fields of interest: botanic gardens and their volunteers, biosecurity (pest plants and animals) and human health. The unbridled enthusiasm for citizen science at each of these events was thick in the air.

My distinct impression is that Governments are really starting to appreciate the enormous potential of citizen science. The Threatened Species Strategy Action Plan 2021-2026 released by the Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment in February 2022 casts citizen science in a leading role; the new Government in SA is working to implement an election commitment to invest substantially in citizen science; and the recently launched Decade of Biosecurity (2021-2030) will be relying on people to be the eyes and ears in surveillance and monitoring of invasive species. The trick is to nurture and channel the enthusiasm to make the most of these opportunities for the betterment of science and society. This all translates to a leadership role for ACSA to make sure citizen science plays the integral part it deserves.

### 2022 ACSA Seed Grants now open!

Do you need a little bit of extra cash for a citizen science initiative you have always wanted to do? Would you like to publish your citizen science research in an open access journal for maximum public benefit but can't quite afford the fees?

ACSA is pleased to announce Seed Grants 2022 are NOW OPEN, closing 29 July 2022.

Seed Grants of \$1000 each will be awarded to two ACSA members to seed their professional growth or their project's growth in line with ACSA's strategic goals of Participation and Practice.

This is our fifth round of Seed Grants and previous recipients have used their grants to achieve some

pretty impressive and far-reaching outcomes. We can't wait to see what's next.

This year we are offering 2 separate grants; Grant 1 is for an initiative or professional development to advance a project & Grant 2 is for publication of a paper in an open access journal.
